Hi Mayor Hope and all,

The MOECC received a complaint about water quality from this landowner on Monday and relayed it to us. We immediately scheduled a site visit to sample the water and have it tested; this visit was scheduled for yesterday at 2pm.

Late Tuesday night we received a note from the same landowner indicating that they did not have water flowing from their well. We reached out to them that night and established that immediate action was not necessary and that we would maintain the 2pm (the next day) meeting.

Aecom staff, which included licensed well contractors, arrived at the residence shortly after 2pm yesterday. Kevin Jakubec was already there. We will receive a formal report from Aecom as soon as lab results are processed; however, the preliminary update from their field staff is that, with no remedial work required, they were able to run a faucet for 7 minutes continuously with no apparent pumping issues. The sample was visually clear and colorless with no visible sediment. We have requested expedited analysis from the lab but, at this point, there is no empirical evidence of an issue.

Happy to discuss further, and will keep you updated as analysis progresses.
